It is time for us all to begin making our plans for this coming October. Among dedicated woodturners throughout the Southwest, October means the annual gathering called the SWATurners Symposium. This year's 17th Annual Symposium will be held from October 17 through 19 at the Waco Convention Center in Waco, Texas. Waco has a nice, large facility and is centrally located for most of our supporting member clubs. There will be two headquarters hotels this year, the Waco Hilton and the Marriott Courtyard. Both are immediately adjacent to the Convention Center. In addition, there are numerous other hotels in Waco, as well as RV facilities. More details on accommodations will be available on the web site soon. In the meantime, if you are in a hurry, you can call the Hilton or the Marriott Courtyard directly. Just be sure to tell them that you are registering for the Southwest Association of Turners Symposium.

Registration and detailed information on this year's Symposium are now available at the SWATurners web site, www.swaturners.org. You may either print out the PDF form and mail it with a check as indicated or register on line. You will note that the Individual and Spouse Registration rates are the same as last year. You can register any time you want, but pre-registration will only be accepted through September 15. We expect to have the mail-out brochure in the mail by mid-June, and it will have a registration form in it as well.
