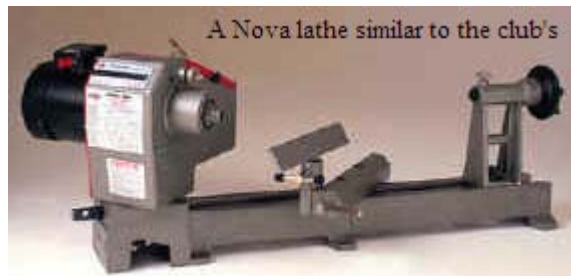

## Lathe Bargain Notice



The ETW Steering Committee recently voted to purchase a new Jet JWL 1642EVS lathe to accommodate the club's monthly demonstrations. This lathe will provide demonstrators with more horsepower while staying within the constraints

of the TJC facility's 110 volt electrical service. The new lathe should be available for use at the October monthly meeting. Along with this purchase the Steering Committee agreed to sell the club's current Nova 3000 lathe for **\$500**. The lathe operates on a standard 110-volt AC circuit. The motor is a DC variable speed and reversible 1HP model. The headstock rotates for easy access when turning the insides of bowls and hollow forms. [Click here](#) for more specifications. It comes with a drive center, live center, tool rest, and knock-out bar. It does **NOT** include the club bench or any legs. At the very most, it has seen about 16 hours of use a year, so it is still quite young. Contact President Charles Brooks if you are interested in purchasing this lathe. 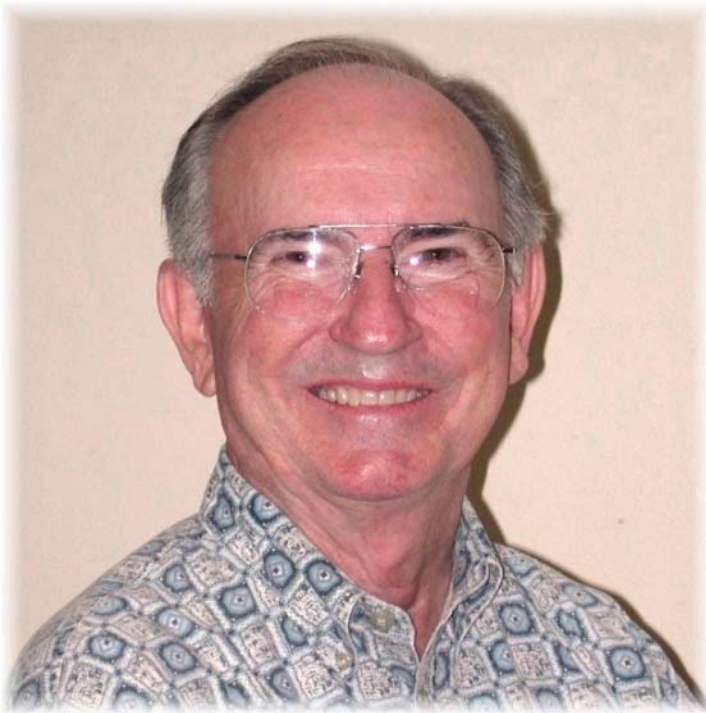

SWAT is all about education. SWAT provides many ways to educate and improve turners abilities. The demonstrations utilize nationally known and local woodturners to present instruction on a wide variety of woodturning subjects. The Instant Gallery provides stimulation and inspiration. The interaction with other turners enables the exchange of knowledge and information. And the participating vendors provide for discussion and in some cases, actual hands-on experience of tools and turning accessories



Last year, over 30 Vendors were present offering lathes, tools, accessories, supplies, wood and even wooden turned items, all to buy or order. All the Vendors were very knowledgeable and able to answer most of my questions. And Vendors usually offer a show discount.

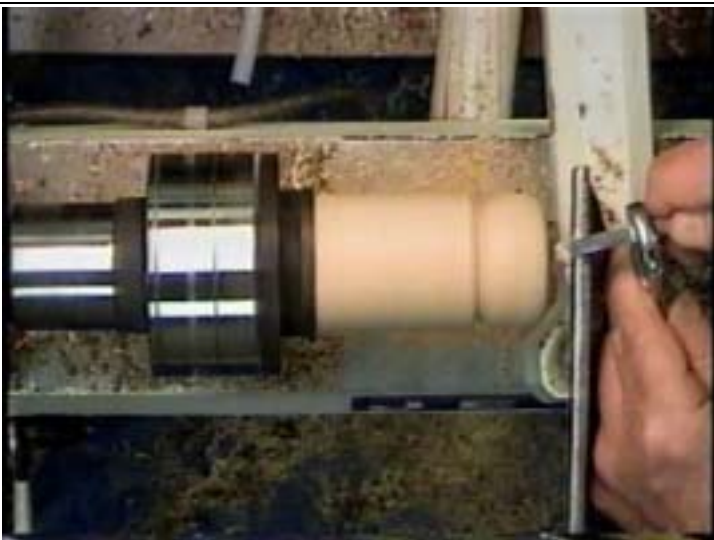

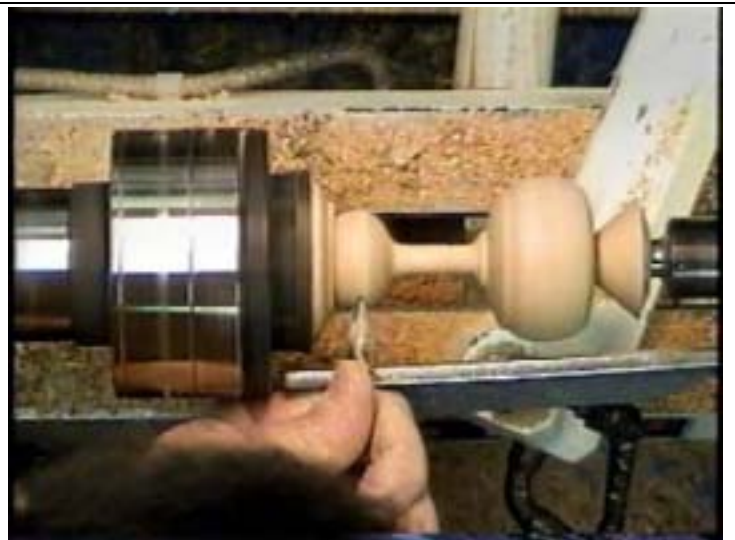
